

Summerfield Road at US-23 Bridge Reconstruction

What Is Being Done?

In 2017, the Michigan Department of Transportation will replace the existing bridge at Summerfield Road over US-23 in Monroe County. The new bridge will be built higher than the existing structure, which will require the approaches on Summerfield Road to be reconstructed approximately 800 feet on either side of US-23. Additional work will be needed to accommodate the grade change, including driveway fixes, drainage improvements and ramp upgrades.

Construction is expected to start in late February and last through mid-July.

How Will Traffic Be Affected?

During construction, Summerfield Road will be closed between Todd Road and Tunnciff Road for approximately four months.

Tunnciff Road will have periodic lane closures, with traffic maintained using flag control. Various ramps will be closed from late March to mid-June. Ramp construction will be staged so only ramps on one side of the freeway will be closed at a time.
