#### **UPDATED 2017 MCRC CONSTRUCTION MAP**


The map outlining the work to be done in 2017 can be found on our website at:

By simply clicking on the "2017 Construction Project Map" link on the MCRC webpage, you can see planned work locations displayed using colored lines. If you select a project on the map by clicking on the colored line, a window will be displayed with information about the work being done and estimated start and

completion dates. The MCRC uses a Google Fusion Table to create and update the information. This method is quicker and can be updated more frequently with less staff time.

The map provides information for planned primary and local road projects, but does not include other work the MCRC is in engaged in such as crack filling, cold patching, mowing, grading gravel roads, dust control, sign maintenance, and culvert maintenance.
